Traditional Learning Program for TK – 6th Grade

Students will return to regular classroom learning with the following safeguards in place:

- Temperatures will be taken prior to students boarding a school bus or entering campus. In alignment with the CDC definition of reportable illnesses, anyone with a measured temperature of 100.4 °F or above will be sent to the nurse to determine if the student should be sent home.
- Self-contained classes on campuses will be reduced in overall size to allow for adequate spacing between student desks. When it may not be possible to have desks six feet apart, other means of providing for social distancing may be utilized such as plexiglass barriers, face shields or face masks.
- To the extent practicable, students will not share basic classroom supplies. Students are welcome to bring personal supplies, backpacks, and lunches from home; however, they will not be able to share the items with others.
- Sanitizing stations will be located throughout each school including at the school entrance, in the lunch area, on playgrounds, and in each classroom. Soap and water at the sink is part of our standard in each classroom; these will be kept supplied. While the drinking fountains in classrooms and on campus have been turned off, water in sinks will be available for students to use for handwashing as well as filling any water bottles they bring from home. In addition, each site has a water bottle filling station near the lunch area.
- Student hand washing/sanitizing will be required after breaks, before lunch, and when returning to class from any shared areas.
- All guidelines outlined by the California Department of Public Health related to cleaning and sanitizing school facilities will be followed with increased cleaning and sanitizing of touch points as required.
- Lunch and break/recesses will be on staggered schedules as needed to encourage appropriate spacing.
- Lunch tables will be wiped down and sanitized in between student lunch periods. School meals will
 be pre-packaged and provided in a 'Grab and Go' format for students to take to their assigned
 eating area.
- All field trips will be eliminated for the first trimester and will be re-evaluated as more information becomes available.
- To the extent practicable, opportunities for large gatherings in which students are not able to have adequate spacing to maintain some distancing will be minimized.
- School sites will limit nonessential visitors, volunteers, and activities involving other groups.
- Schools will follow the local and state guidelines related to masks, face coverings and face shields. At this time, face coverings are required in California; we will follow the requirements. Face covering guidelines may include:
- Teach and reinforce use and potential benefit of cloth face coverings, masks, or face shields, especially when physical distancing is not feasible.
- Recognize that some people have medical or mental health conditions that prevent them from effectively or safely wearing a face covering.
- All students and staff will be required to wear a mask while on a school bus where social distancing is not possible.
- Mandates by the Orange County Health Care Agency, California Department of Public Health, and the Center for Disease Control will be followed.
